- x A well-honed sense of introspection/sæflection is sometimesnissing when students start college.
- x Financial literacytime management skilland fostering a sense of resiliencere areas cited as needingnore emphasis during high school.

 - f BPSgrads overperformed in applied English and underformed in math.
 - f In my experience, students who can read, write, and are articulate tend to do well; the students that are ostrong in math and weak in writing and verbal skills tend to not be as successful.
 - f In terms of placement in collegievel math, BPS studens perform well relative to other studes in Whatcom County and beyond.
 - f I find my strongest students are those where in English and theater, they can create.
 - f Students who stop at Algebra II cammetimes flounder.
- x How might we better prepare our students?
 - o There is a financial literacy component that is sometimes lacking. This is not specific toBPSgraduates. Foexample, our students need a level of increased awareness in such areas as filling out the FAFSA applications, or understanding credit scoring and credit card debt.

- o Regarding Running Start:
