Special Education and Inclusive Learning Environments to Support Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)

Courtney Ross Webb, Director of Special Education, Steve Ruthford, Fairhaven Middle School Principal and Sarah Walker, Lowell Elementary School Principal, shared information about Special Education, how students qualify to receive services and what an inclusive learning environment can look like at school.

Steve talked about the inclusion journey at Fairhaven and their focus on engagement and belonging. He said Fairhaven is focused on using inclusive language and supporting students in the least restrictive environment, which could be in the general education classroom or in a resource room.

Sarah said Lowell is working hard to create an inclusive school. She said inclusive classrooms are better for students receiving Special Education services as well as for students in general education. She said at Lowell, they support students by looking at needs and access; what does the student need and how do we access those resources for each student, acknowledging each student is different. She shared that inquiry supports inclusionary practices.
