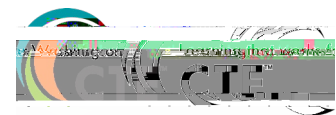

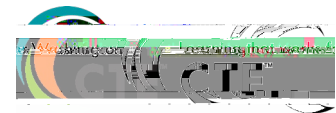

CTE Conditional List - Updated

Process of selecting staff for CTE assignments if they are out of endorsement

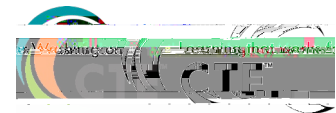
NEEDS APPROVAL

Candidate must be highly experienced in the knowledge and occupational skills of the CTE program to be certified.

CTE Conditional certificate is issued for two school years or less and is initiated by the district.

The two-year conditional CTE certificate enables a school district, which cannot find a regularly certificated CTE instructor in a specific area, to hire someone who is highly qualified and experienced in that area.

The certificate is subject to specific limitations and the teacher must complete a written training plan developed in coordination with the CTE administrator and the CTE advisory committee. WAC 181-77-014

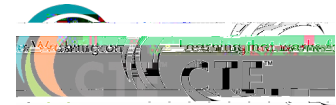
